



A GUIDE TO QUEUEING 2025

On behalf of everyone at The All England Lawn Tennis Club, we would like to extend a very warm welcome to the Queue 2025.

The Queue is managed by a team of experienced stewards, who are available to help and guide you, and who operate a Queue Code of Conduct.

When you arrive you should proceed to the end of the Queue where you will be issued with a Queue Card. This card is numbered and dated and should be retained until you have purchased your ticket.

If you haven't already done so, you will be asked to download the Wimbledon App and create a *myWIMBLEDON* account. Guest Wi-Fi is available in the Guests Services kiosk should you require it. The stewards will scan your *myWIMBLEDON* ID in order to check you into the Queue, and by doing so you will be able to view the status of the Queue, and information about the food and drink and Official Partner activity that is available in the Queue Village, the area after you have purchased your ticket.

The ticket purchaser will also be required to present their *myWIMBLEDON* ID when paying for the ticket(s) and all guests will require a *myWIMBLEDON* account should they wish to join the Ticket Resale virtual queue.

Unfortunately, we cannot provide information regarding how long you will have to queue for, however our aim is to get everyone into the Grounds as quickly as possible once the gates open until we reach capacity.

STAYING OVERNIGHT

If you are staying overnight, please be aware that only two person tents are permitted. You will be woken up between 5.30am and 6am and asked to leave your bags and equipment in the left luggage facilities.

ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

There is a dedicated waiting area for guests who require assistance, with a buggy service available to reach the ticket sales tent should you require it. Please ask a steward for assistance when you arrive. Entry into the Grounds for all visitors will be in Queue Card number order. 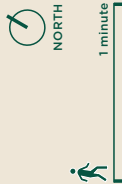

TICKETS AVAILABLE TO THE QUEUE

Tickets available on a daily basis are as follows:

Centre Court - A limited number of tickets are available for the first 10 days only. Tickets for the final four days are sold in advance.

No.1 Court - A limited number of tickets are available each day of the event.

No.2 Court - A limited number of tickets are available for the first 10 days only.

Grounds Pass ticket - A Grounds Pass ticket gives you entry to the Grounds where you can watch matches in unreserved seats on No.3 Court, Court 12 and Court 18. Outside courts 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16 and 17 also have unreserved seating. For No.3 Court, a queue operates from the southern end.

TICKET RESALE

Subject to availability, you can purchase Show Court tickets after 3pm from the Ticket Resale kiosk inside the Grounds at Parkside, north of Gate 3.

Queuing for tickets will be via a virtual queue using the Wimbledon App and you can sign up for this in the Queue Village.

Tickets are £15 for Centre Court and £10 for No. 1 Court and No. 2 Court, with all proceeds (net of VAT) donated to the Wimbledon Foundation.

Please be aware if tickets become available all ticket purchases will take place at the Ticket Resale kiosk inside the Grounds in Parkside, north of Gate 3.

CURTAILMENT OF PLAY

Do not buy tickets from touts or other unauthorised agents; they will not gain you entry to the Grounds.

Tickets with the word 'debenture' printed on them in place of the price may be legally transferred or sold on; however, we advise guests to check that any tickets they are offered by unofficial websites are indeed debenture tickets.

All other tickets are strictly non-transferable and must neither be sold nor advertised or offered for sale whether on the internet, in newspapers or elsewhere. Any such tickets which are transferred, advertised or offered for sale will be void.

THE QUEUE CODE OF CONDUCT

The AELTC, in accordance with statutory authority, reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone adopting unreasonable social behaviour or who causes obstruction, danger or annoyance and/or commits any action against the spirit of this Code of Conduct.

Please help our stewards by taking note of these important points relating to the Queue:

- You are in the Queue if you join it at the end, and have been issued with a valid numbered and dated Queue Card. You must retain your Queue Card until you reach the ticket sales structure where you can purchase a Championships ticket.
- Queue Cards are strictly non-transferable. You may not reserve a place in the Queue for somebody else.
- Keep your Queue Card with you at all times. Queue Cards may be checked by a steward at any point.
- Temporary absence from the Queue for purchase of refreshments or toilet breaks should not exceed 30 minutes.
- Overnight queuers must only use tents which accommodate a maximum of two persons, and one person should be present at all times. Gazebos must not be brought to the Queue.
- Unattended items will be removed and may be destroyed by the police.
- Barbecues, camping stoves or fires are not permitted in the Queue or in Wimbledon Park.
- Smoking/vaping in the Queue is strictly forbidden.
- Antisocial behaviour likely to cause annoyance or offence to other queuers will not be tolerated. Loud music must not be played at any time.
- Excessive consumption of alcohol and/or drunken behaviour will not be tolerated.
- Do not play music or ball games after 10pm.
- All litter should be put in the refuse bags/bins provided.
- Any take-away food deliveries must be arranged for collection at the Wimbledon Park Road gate only and must arrive before 10pm.

SECURITY (PROHIBITED ITEMS)

We work closely with the Metropolitan Police to ensure the safety of everyone in our Grounds. In order to achieve this, security measures are in place at all times, which means that at your point of entry, we will search both you and your bags. Bag sizes are restricted to 40cm x 30cm x 30cm (16" x 12" x 12"). Please bear in mind that it takes longer to search multi-pocketed bags/backpacks therefore your choice of bag will impact how long the search will take. Restrictions are in place on what you can bring into the Grounds – see prohibited items below. Any prohibited items inadvertently brought to The Championships can be deposited at left luggage facilities outside the Grounds (see map on pages 16 and 18). Any items discovered after entry through the gates will be confiscated and cannot be collected on exit.



*Please note, all Russian and Belarusian flags and associated imagery, political statements, symbols, images, insignia or emblems are prohibited from the Grounds.

We value your assistance in helping to ensure the safety and security of all our guests. If you see anything suspicious during your visit, please don't hesitate to alert a member of staff, steward or police officer.
